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1. Work Maturity Checklist

Some feedback from Cannon Cameron on using the checklist:

- Keep in mind that this is only a tool and should not be used as a grading system but rather a progress monitoring tool. The pdf, Orange County Work Maturity Student Scales, provides the tool that can be used with students.
- The Orange County Work Maturity Data Collection and Assessment Excel file that is being shared is the master and you should save it as such. If you modified the spreadsheet without saving it first you would lose the conditional formatting that is needed for the spreadsheet to operate correctly.
- The pdf, Orange County Work Maturity sample, is also included.
- Members of the Orange County ESE Transition Services team have also created a student self-assessment that aligns with the tool. Many Orange County ESE teachers use parts of the ULS transition curriculum so it has a similar design. Orange County also has a separate training on how to have Data Chats with your students, which is phase two of using the Work Maturity Checklist.

2. Student Resume using QR code
